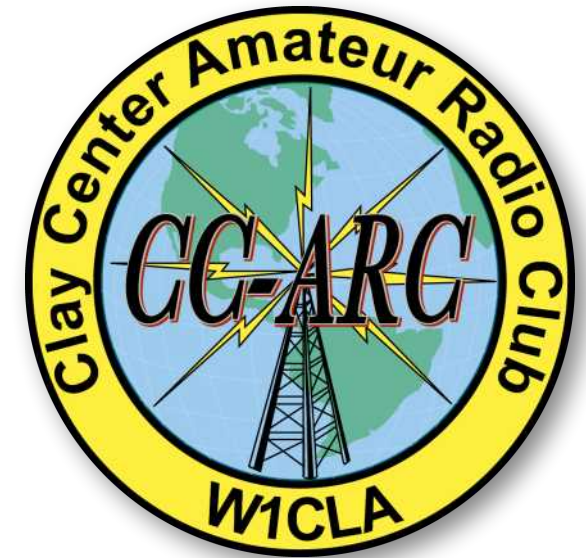

Who We Are

There are active members who are FCC-licensed HAMs, provisional members who are working on their HAM technician licenses, and supporting members who oversee the club activities and lend help or expertise where needed.



Where We Meet

The CC-ARC is based on the top floor of the Clay Center Observatory high on a hill on the campus of Dexter Southfield School in Brookline, MA. There is a radio room set up with HF, VHF, and UHF rigs, a conference room with a kitchenette for meetings and classes, a world-class telescopic observatory, and 360-degree views of Greater Boston.

How To Join

Currently, there is no fee to join. Filling out the application gives you membership privileges including, among other things, emailed newsletters and invitations to club events and activities. There are no age restrictions, however it is recommended that children be at least age 10 and that a parent enroll as a supporting member for youth under age 18. Join online: www.cc-arc.org.
