

DXCC Accounts


For DXCC, an account is created for each unique combination of call sign and DXCC Entity. For exam certificates bearing these call signs and DXCC Entities:

- W1AW (USA)
- 1AW (USA) -- old call
- W1HQ (USA) -- club call
- W1AW/D (USA) -- portable operation
- VE3/W1AW (Canada) -- expedition

As matching QSO records (QSLs) were uploaded from other stations, a DXCC award account would t

If you have more than one call sign in the same DXCC Entity, you can merge the accounts to make tl merge the W1AW (USA), 1AW (USA) and W1AW/D (USA) accounts into one account. Under DXCC |

A QSO Set is a list of rules that define QSOs that will be matched. Your account can include more than one QSO S the awards.

The rules that make up a QSO Set each compare the value of a field related to the QSO. The fields that may be use QSO, the QSO date, and several geographical fields. At least one rule must be included in a QSO Set in order to m

If more than one rule is present in the QSO Set, you may choose whether the QSOs must match *all* of the specified




